1 Kings 17:2 Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah: 3 "Leave here, turn eastward and hide in the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan. 4 You will drink from the brook, and I have directed the ravens to supply you with food there."

**5** So he did what the Lord had told him. He went to the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan, and stayed there. **6** The ravens brought him

**1 Kings 19:1** Now Ahab told Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. **2** So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah to say, "May the gods deal with me, be it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of one of them."

**3** Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, **4** while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had **enough**, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." **5** Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep.

All at once an angel touched him and said, "Get up and eat." 6 He looked around, and there by his head was some bread baked over hot coals, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again.

7 The angel of the Lord came back a second time and touched him and said, "Get up and eat, for the journey is **too much** for you." **8** So he got up and ate and drank.

**Strengthened** by that food, he traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. **9** There he went into a cave and spent the night.

In doing so we prove the words Jesus quoted during His own fast: "man does not live by bread alone but by every word that precedes from the mouth of God."


Fast from judging others

Feast on gratitude



# God Provides



In the Gospels, Jesus likens the kingdom of God to **a banquet** multiple times.

#### Jewish Expectation of the Great Feast

"On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare

a feast of rich food for all peoples,

a banquet of aged wine--

the best of meats and the finest of wines.

On this mountain he will *swallow up* the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; he will *swallow up* death forever.

The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces;

he will remove the disgrace of his people

from all the earth." (Isaiah 25:6-8)




#### Jesus Looked Forward to the Great Feast, during the Last Supper

"For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds **fulfillment** in the kingdom of God." (Luke 22:16)

"I tell you, I will **not** drink of this fruit of the vine from now on **until that day when I drink it anew with you in my Father's kingdom**." (Matthew 26:29 || Mark 14:25)

"For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death **until he comes**." (1 Corinthians 11:26)

"Fulfillment" is the verb *plēroō*, "to make full." Here it could have one of two meanings: "to bring to a designed end, fulfill" a prophecy, a promise, etc., or "to bring to completion an activity in which one has been involved from its beginning, complete, finish."8 Indeed, the Lord's Supper is *fulfilled* at the Great Banquet. This gathering of the redeemed of the Lord in the presence of God on the Last Day is the culmination and fulfillment of the incarnation, the cross, and the resurrection.

#### Who will be there?

In Luke 14, Jesus **cautions** against throwing a feast just for friends, family, or those who could repay you and from being status seeking.

This chapter looks at how the vulnerable and marginalized have a place at God's table ...

and at how our king takes the seat of least honor as an example for us to follow

(Indian cultural tradition about welcoming your guest as if they were the Lord; hosts eating after/last!)



#### Luke 14 - The Parable of the Great Banquet

**15** When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God."

**16** Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. **17** At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.'

**18** "But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.'

19 "Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.'

20 "Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'


#### $\rightarrow$ NO GOOD EXCUSES

**21** "The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.'

22 "Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.'

**23** "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full.

24 I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet." → DON'T MISS OUT


