

Abraham, for Sarah (Gen 23:2)

David, for Saul and Jonathan (2 Sam 1); for Abner (2 Sam 3:31), for Absalom (2 Sam 18:33)

Job, for **calamities/personal disasters** (deaths of loved ones, loss of wealth and status, personal sickness) in Job 3:1-26, 30:26-31

Laments for Cities/States

Prophets grieve over states and cities

Jeremiah 6:26, Micah 1:8-9 - Jerusalem

Ezekiel 27 - Tyre

Ezekiel 32 - Egypt

Lamentations is a series of **funeral dirges** for **Jerusalem** (destroyed 586 BC by Babylonians)


Jeremiah sees Jerusalem's fall as being the will of God, judgment for sin

LAMENTATIONS 3

1 I am the man who has seen affliction...

4 He has made my flesh and my skin waste away; he has broken my bones;

...6 he has made me dwell in darkness

like the dead of long ago.

7 He has walled me about so that I cannot escape;

he has made my chains heavy;

8 though I call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer;...

10 He is a bear lying in wait for me, a lion in hiding;

...13 He drove into my kidneys the arrows of his quiver; 14 I have become the laughingstock of all peoples, the object of their taunts all day long.

LAMENTATIONS 4

4 Because of thirst the infant's tongue sticks to the roof of its mouth; the children beg for bread,

but no one gives it to them.

10 With their own hands compassionate women

have cooked their own children,

who became their food when my people were destroyed.

13 But it happened because of the sins of her prophets

and the iniquities of her priests,

who shed within her the blood of the righteous.

LAMENTATIONS 5

- 3 We have become fatherless, our mothers are widows.
- 4 We must buy the water we drink; our wood can be had only at a price.
- 10 Our skin is hot as an oven, feverish from hunger.
- 11 Women have been violated in Zion, and virgins in the towns of Judah.
- 14 The elders are gone from the city gate; the young men have stopped their music.
- 15 Joy is gone from our hearts; our dancing has turned to mourning.
- 16 The crown has fallen from our head. Woe to us, for we have sinned!
- 21 Restore us to yourself, Lord, that we may return; renew our days as of old
- 22 unless you have utterly rejected us and are angry with us beyond measure.

Breakthrough moment (right around "G")

- 3:20 My soul continually remembers it and is bowed down within me.
- 21 But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope:
- 22 The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end;
- 23 they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.
- 24 "The Lord is my portion," says <u>my soul</u>, "therefore I will hope in him."

- 25 The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.
- **26** It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.
- 27 It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth.
- 28 <u>Let him</u> sit alone in silence when it is laid on him;
- 29 <u>let him</u> put his mouth in the dust—there may yet be hope;
- 30 <u>let him give</u> his cheek to the one who strikes, and let him be filled with insults.

- 31 For the Lord will not cast off forever,
- 32 but, though he cause grief, he will have compassion according to the abundance of his steadfast love;
- 33 for he does not afflict from his heart or grieve the children of men.
- 55 "I called on your name, O Lord, from the depths of the pit;
- 56 you heard my plea, 'Do not close your ear to my cry for help!'
- 57 You came near when I called on you; you said, 'Do not fear!'







and receive Christ anew this Christmas.


