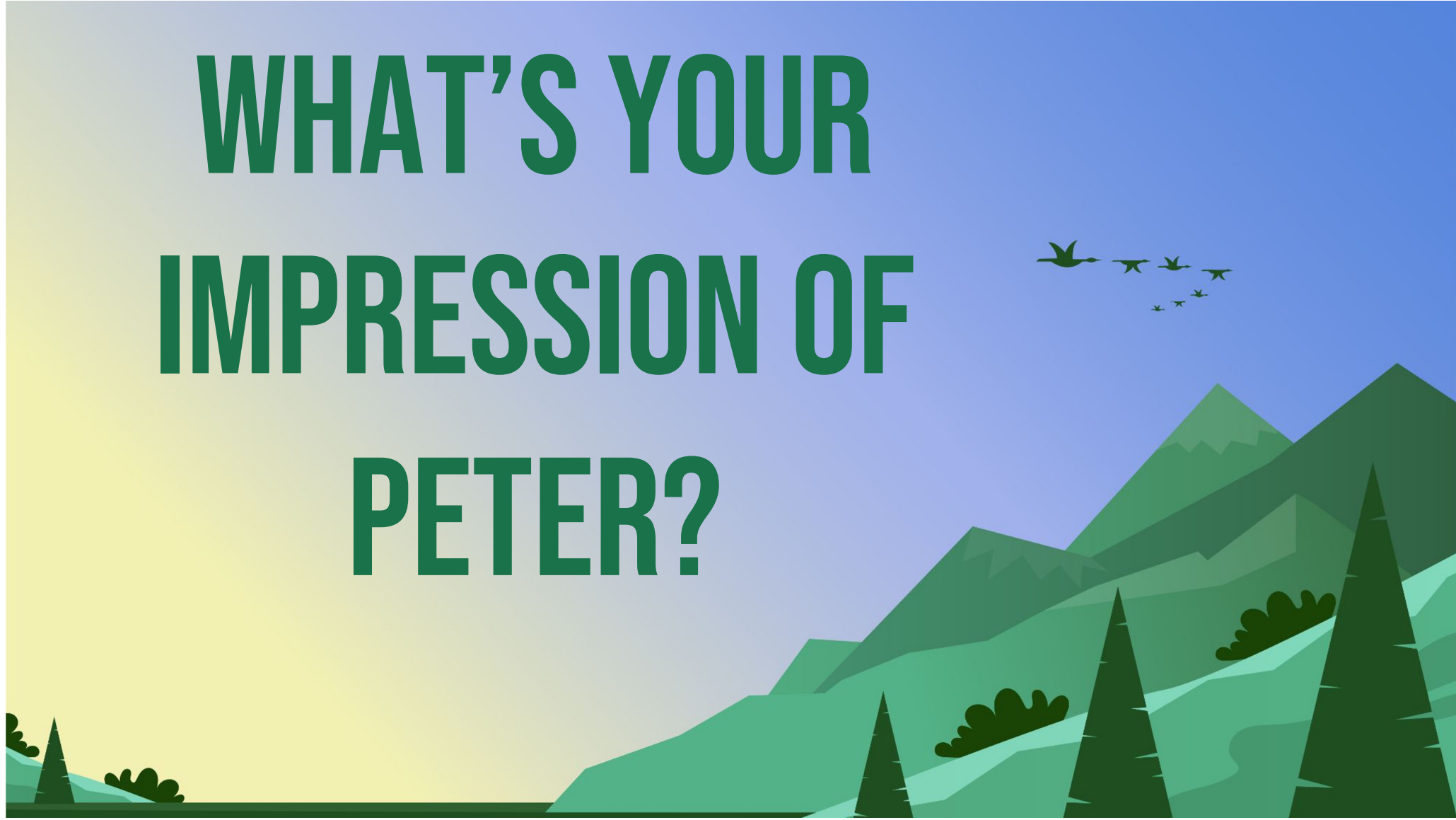

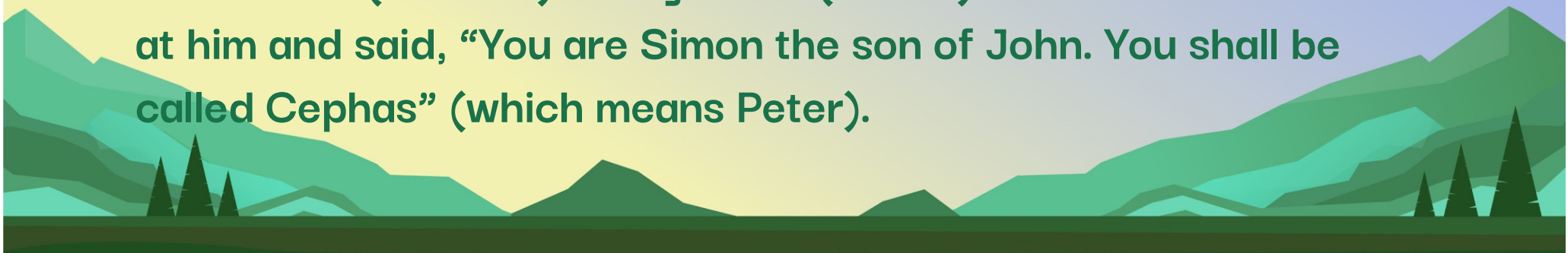
WHO WAS PETER THE APOSTLE?

Mark 1:29; Luke 5:3;
John 1:42

Mark 1:29 **And immediately he (Jesus) left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill .. That evening, at sundown, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed by demons ...**

Luke 5:3 **Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land> And he sat down and taught the people from the boat**

John 1:42 **He (Andrew) brought him (Simon) to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John. You shall be called Cephas" (which means Peter).**

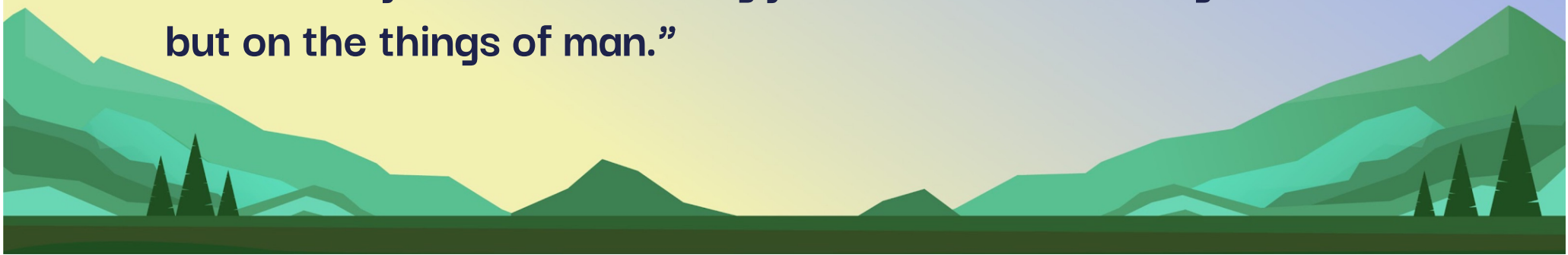
