


and stop confronting us with the Holy One of Israel!"


Belfast, Northern Ireland

Chap 1 - The Doctrine of Discovery and Why It Matters

Dum Diversas 1452

(it's okay to capture and enslave Muslims and pagans)

Romanus Pontifex 1455

(it's okay to expand dominion over 'discovered' lands for defense and increase of the faith)

Inter Caetera 1493

(gave spiritual validation for European conquest, 'spread of Christian rule,' 'barbarous nations be overthrown and brought to the faith itself')



"the Doctrine of Christian European Discovery Arrival Invasion"

"Prince Henry [uncle to king of Portugal] following his deepest Christian instincts, **ordered a tithe be given to God through the church.**

Two black boys were given.'

So, **the slave trade becomes an act of worship** in the diseased imagination of the Europen explorers engaged in it." (18)



Aquinas in the <u>13th century</u> elevated **heresy** to an action **punishable by death**. So the "infidel" -- anyone outside the Christian faith -- could be enslaved and killed. \rightarrow this allowed for genocidal action.



Augustine: just war theory \rightarrow sets the stage for the Crusades in the <u>11th century</u>

It justified the right of Christendom to use violent means to defend the faith

Chap 4 - Rise and Defense of CHRISTENDOM



Formerly persecuted Christians relieved, but this establishes, for the first time, the existence of a "Christian Empire" -- and its leader as "God's chosen ruler"

312 AD - Constantine (emperor of Rome) consolidates power by winning a civil war. He sees a vision of the cross and converts to Christianity.

313 AD - signs Edict of Milan, proclaiming religious tolerance throughout Roman Empire.

325 AD - calls the Council of Nicaea, producing the Nicene Creed.

330 AD - consolidates entire Roman Empire under his rule

→ Christianity becomes official religion of Roman Empire ⇒
Christendom is born


What's wrong with "Christendom"?

"Instead of joining the church *intentionally, sacrificially,* and *in opposition to empire,* membership in the church now **depended upon** citizenship in, and allegiance to, one of the most powerful and historically oppressive empires in the world." 58

The teachings of Jesus, his disciples, and the apostle Paul do not gesture towards Christendom. Central to Christianity is sacrificial love and the laying down of one's life. Empires are concerned with self-preservation, conquest, and expansion...Jesus' disciples left everything -- their livelihoods and their security -to follow him. 58

Jesus' kingship: nonviolent; he trusted God. c 33 CE

John 18:10 Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, cutting off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.)11 Jesus commanded Peter, "Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?"



36 Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world.
If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jewish leaders.
But now my kingdom is from another place."




Vibrant: creative with outreach, deep in discipleship
