he prophesied, "You are a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek." <sup>18</sup> Yes, the old requirement about the priesthood was set aside because it was weak and useless. <sup>19</sup> For the law never made anything perfect. But now we have confidence in a better hope, through which we draw near to God. Heb 7:11-19, NLT
Q 6 – Why is Jesus' priesthood better than the Levitical priesthood? It is because
The <i>old</i> priesthood had priests who, but the <i>new</i> priesthood has priest who
<sup>23</sup> There were many priests under the old system, for death prevented them from remaining in office. <sup>24</sup> But because Jesus lives forever, his priesthood lasts forever. <sup>25</sup> Therefore he is able, once and forever, to save those who come to God through him. He lives forever to intercede with God on their behalf. Heb 7:23-25, NLT (Also see 1 John 2:1)
The former priests offered a sacrifice for, whereas the new priest Jesus is
<sup>26</sup> He is the kind of high priest we need because he is holy and blameless, unstained by sin. He has been set apart from sinners and has been given the highest place of honor in heaven. <sup>27</sup> Unlike those other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices every day. They did this for their own sins first and then for the sins of the people. But Jesus did this once for all when he offered himself as the sacrifice for the people's sins. Heb 7:26-27, NLT
The former priests entered a tent to offer animal sacrifices that permanently take away sin, but Jesus entered and offered His own blood, which sets us free from sin
For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Heb 10:4, ESV
But when Christ came as the high priest of the good things we now have, he entered the greater and more perfect tent. It is not made by humans and does not belong to this world. <sup>12</sup> Christ entered the Most Holy Place only once—and for all time. He did not take with him the blood of goats and calves. His sacrifice was his own blood, and by it he set us free from sin forever. Hebrews 9:11-12, NCV
The Old Testament priests offering animal sacrifices, but Jesus offered Himself as one sacrifice and then a God's right hand.
After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. Heb 1:3, NIV
Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. <sup>12</sup> But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, <sup>13</sup> and since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool. <sup>14</sup> For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy. Heb 10:11-14, NIV
